While assigned to administrative services, Commander Reed worked as aide to the Chief of Police researching and writing department polices, conducting community outreach activities and managing the department's information technology structure. Commander Reed served as the manager of the public information and technology section until his promotion to the rank of Commander in June of 2005.
